Purpose

The Department of Veterinary Services Malaysia (DVS) has advised Biosecurity Australia that the requirement for livestock to be tested with a negative result for Q fever using an ELISA within 14 days of export has been waived for 3 months (from 21 March 2008).

Industry will be advised of any further developments relating to this matter.

Instructions

- Exporters are not required to test livestock for Q fever for consignments of livestock exported to Malaysia in the 3 months from 21 March 2008 – 21 June 2008.
- Exporters that have an existing approval of an NOI that contains this testing requirement as a condition of the approval are not required to test the livestock for Q fever for consignments of livestock to be exported in the period 21 March 2008 – 21 June 2008.
