
At 11.00 am today I had a call from Malcolm Jackman, CEO Elders International. He was concerned that

- we are not giving approval for 1900 head of cattle to leave the registered premises at Port Hedland and then to board the Falconia – notwithstanding that they are destined for an Elders feedlot in Indonesia
- Elders will need to truck fodder to the registered premises or they will run out of fodder after tonight
- Elders is incurring demurrage while there is uncertainty about the loading

I said at this time I wasn't in a position to comment on when or if permission would be given, but that I would contact him as soon as there were any developments.

I also pointed out that the registered premises operator is required to carry enough fodder to feed animals daily – as specified in the Australian Standards for the Export of Livestock – and should be in a position to manage contingencies that involve delay at the premises
