Note: This permit covers AQIS quarantine requirement only.

All imports may be subject to quarantine inspection on arrival to determine compliance with the listed permit conditions and freedom from contamination. Imports not in compliance or not appropriately identified or packaged and labelled in accordance with the import conditions they represent may be subject to seizure, treatment, re-export or destruction at the importer's expense. Additionally, all foods imported into Australia must comply with the provisions of the *Imported Food Control Act 1992*, and may be inspected and/or analysed against the requirements of the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code. All imports containing or derived from Genetically Modified material must comply with the *Gene Technology Act 2000*.

It is the importer's responsibility to identify, and to ensure it has complied with, all requirements of any other regulatory organisations and advisory bodies prior to and after importation including The Australian Customs Service, The Department of Health and Ageing, Therapeutic Goods Administration, Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority, Department of the Environment, Water, Heritage and the Arts, Food Standards Australia New Zealand and any state agencies such as Departments of Agriculture and Health and Environmental Protection authorities. Importers should note that this list is not exhaustive.

This permit is granted for the purposes of the *Quarantine Act 1908* and *Quarantine Proclamation 1998* of the Commonwealth of Australia. The laws of Australian States and Territories may also impose restrictions on the import of animals, plants and other goods into those States and Territories. This import permit does not prevent the application of those State and Territory laws. The importer should seek its own advice on any restrictions that may apply in any State or Territory into which it is proposed to import the animals, plants or other goods to which this permit relates.

Import conditions are subject to change at the discretion of the Director of Quarantine. This permit may be revoked without notice.

Notification of the import must be provided to AQIS for all imported goods other than goods imported as accompanied baggage or goods imported via the mail and not prescribed under the *Customs Act 1901*. Notification must be consistent with *Quarantine Regulations 2000* (examples include a Quarantine Entry or a Quarantine declaration).

PC0600 Conditions for the return of sheep to Adelaide

1. The sheep may be held on the vessel "Al Messilah" pending export, and while any sheep are held on the vessel:

(a) no person may access the sheep unless first specifically authorised by AQIS, and the importer must keep and make available to AQIS upon request a record containing details of all personnel permitted such access;

(b) all personnel accessing the sheep must wear disposable outer clothing and dedicated, cleaned and disinfected or disposable footwear;

(c) footwear used near the sheep must be cleaned to the satisfaction of AQIS before leaving the wharf;

(d) all equipment used in feeding, handling and treating sheep on the vessel must be cleaned and disinfected to the satisfaction of AQIS before removal from the vessel; and

(e) veterinary therapeutics, fodder and animal waste matter is not to be unloaded from the vessel.

2. If the importer wishes to unload and move any of the sheep from the vessel:

(a) only those persons specifically authorised by AQIS may have access to the sheep, the vessel and the trucks used for moving the sheep and the importer must keep and make available to AQIS upon request a record containing details of all personnel permitted such access.

(b) no other ruminants may be brought within 400 metres of the wharf area used for the shipment until the wharf area has been cleaned and disinfected after unloading of the vessel has been completed

(c) the sheep may only be moved by truck, by the most direct route that avoids exposure to other livestock, to ^{s47G(1)(a)} (the Feedlot) if a permission to move goods subject to quarantine is issued to the importer under s 44B of the Quarantine Act 1908;

(d) all personnel accessing the sheep must wear disposable outer clothing which must be left at the wharf, or be worn to the feedlot and disposed there;

(e) all personnel accessing the sheep must wear dedicated, cleaned and disinfected footwear, cleaned to the satisfaction of AQIS before leaving the wharf, or disposable footwear which must be left at the wharf, or be worn to the feedlot and disposed there;

(f) the sheep must be loaded on to dedicated trucks that are clean prior to their first load;

(g) a register of trucks (using identifying number plates) must be maintained by the importer,

including time of loading and time of unloading of each load of sheep;

(h) the trucks must be driven directly to the Feedlot, not carry any other loads until they have completed the unloading of the sheep from the vessel to the Feedlot;

(i) on completion of all loading/unloading procedures, the trucks must be thoroughly cleaned and then disinfected with Virkon S;

(j) all equipment used in feeding, handling and treating sheep on the wharf and trucks must be cleaned and disinfected to the satisfaction of AQIS before removal from wharf and trucks;

(k) all manure on the wharf and ramps must be collected and sealed in plastic bags before being disposed of in an AQIS approved manner;

(l) veterinary therapeutics, fodder and animal waste matter are not to be unloaded from the vessel.

Note: Upon arrival at the Feedlot the sheep will be released into the control of the South Australian government.

3. All costs associated with compliance with these conditions are the responsibility of the importer.
