Payment of fees. <p>A "certificate of free sale" and/or "certificate of free sale" isn't required.</p> <p>Shipping marks (identified as the lot number by Mexican Authorities) that appears on all carton labels and outer tags, should always exactly match that on the health certificate. If industry wishes to indicate the <i>production lot</i> on carton labels, alternative words such as "<i>batch number</i>" should be used to avoid confusion.</p> <p>All exporters are required to include the packing date of the product on the Health Certificate for export to Mexico.</p> <p>Mexican requirements regarding country of origin requirements are currently being updated and exporters should check with the DRU prior to completion of export certification.</p> <p>E cert is in place.</p> <p>When product transits the USA</p> <p>The USA aim to prevent entry of Foot and Mouth Disease and Rinderpest and certification and sealing requirements reflect this.</p> <p>Where AQIS seals are applied for dairy product to the USA, the seal number/s and relevant container number/s should be included in the RFP.</p> <p>For all product sealed with an AQIS seal the following words should be included in the Exporter Declaration or inspector comments field: AQIS seal (include number/s) applied at est (number) by AQIS officer (name) or (company employee name) from (company) under an approved self sealing system.</p> <p>Only AQIS/AFFA issued 5 or 6 digit numeric character seals</p>

	<p>should be included in the RFP.</p> <p>When product transits a USA port and the "country of final destination" is not the USA, then AQIS has been advised that USA certification, including sealing requirement, is required in addition to the "country of final destination" certification.</p> <p>If product is transitting a US port and AQIS seals are applied, the US should be included as country of discharge or transit country or a reference should be included in the exporter declaration or inspector comments to indicate that the product maybe transitting a US port.</p>
