The above product/s is/are fit for human consumption, is/are freely sold in Australia and can be exported from Australia"</p> <p>The letter should be signed and dated by an AQIS authorised officer.</p> <p>The Philippines government require that the importer obtain a Veterinary Quarantine Certificate (VQC) for animal products (including dairy products) before the animal products (including dairy products) leave the country of origin. This is a permit issued by the Philippines government and exporters should confirm with their importers that this has occurred. If the VQC has not been obtained in accordance with the Philippines requirements, then consignments may be detained by the Philippines authorities.</p>
